The outstanding achievement planned was the Scrap Metal Drive and with the cooperation of the Student Body, twenty tons of scrap was collected for the War Effort.

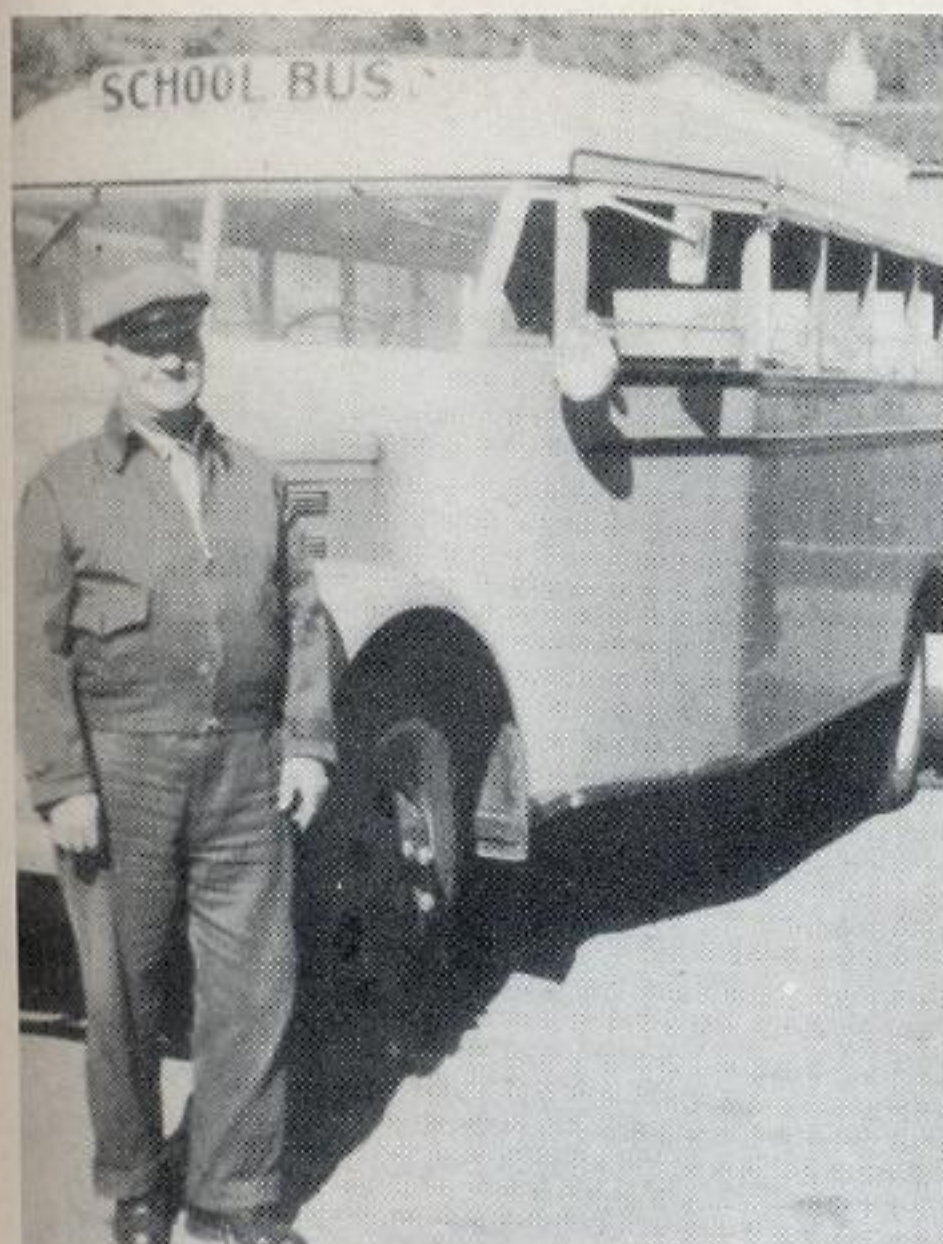

It was also the duty of the Student Council to decide on the method of distributing athletic letters, since the war conditions prevented inter-school sports.

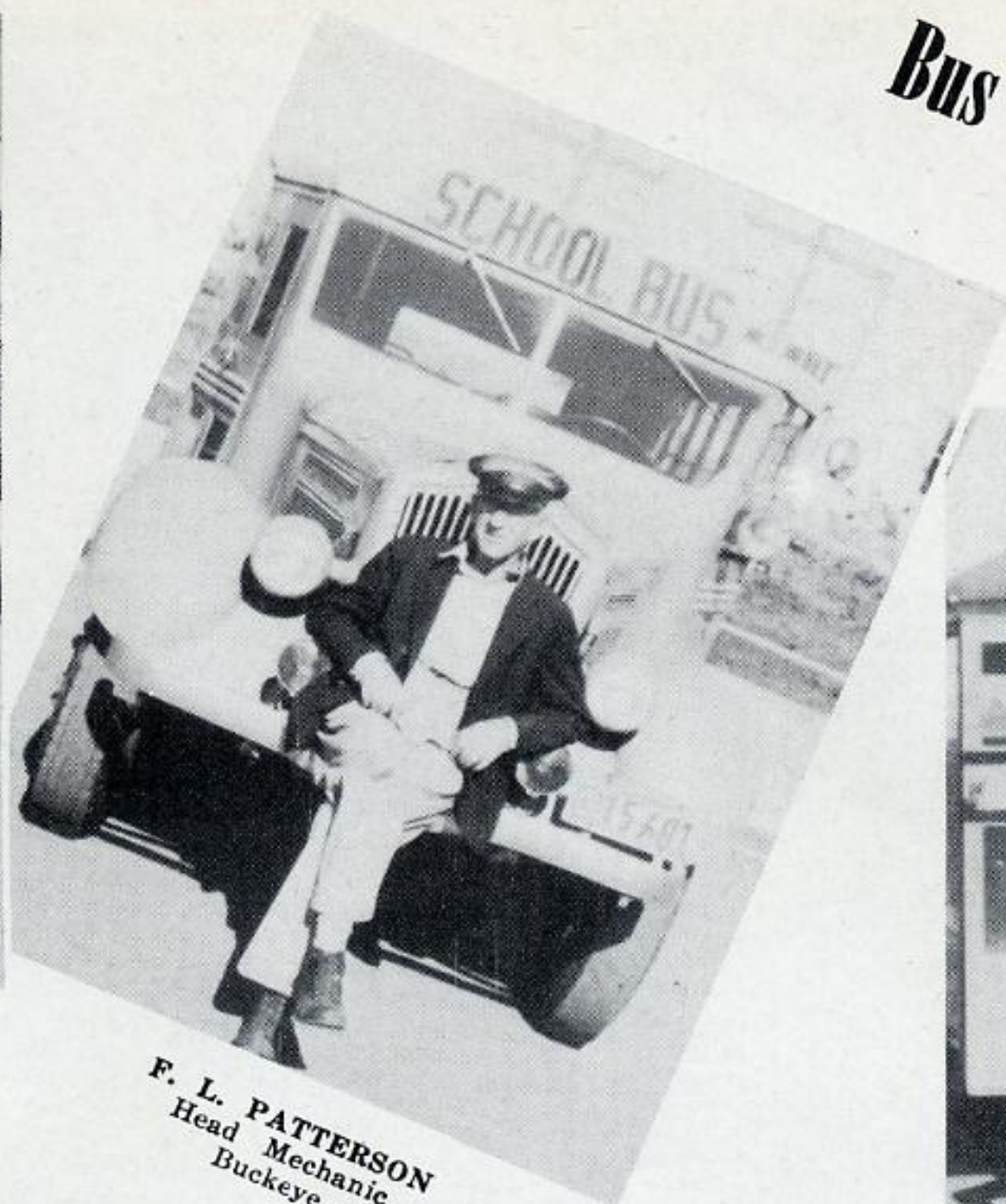
And last, but by no means the least, of the activities was the sponsorship of the annual Christmas tree and party.
